### **Amazing Georgian Bay**

Have you heard about the **Amazing Places of Georgian Bay**?

Though perhaps less known than Algonquin Park, the Georgian Bay Biosphere Reserve is a unique geographic area running 200km from the French River north of Parry Sound,

south to Port Severn in Muskoka that is, like its neighbour to the east, recognized as ecologically significant in the world. Known as the 30,000 Islands as well, it's also just plain awesome.

Designated a **UNESCO World Biosphere** in 2004 and home to the world's largest freshwater archipelago, fans of the biosphere recently voted for their **Top Ten Amazing Places to visit** in the **Parry Sound** and **Muskoka** areas.

This summer, visit the **Amazing Places of the Georgian Bay Biosphere Reserve**, including **Johnston's Cranberry Marsh** in Bala and **Tower Hill & Park in Parry Sound**. And consider a special tour of the 30,000 Islands by boat or plane.

### Live Music in Cottage Country

On patios and stages across the region (including many located lakeside), hundreds of venues will host exceptional artists as part of cottage country's 2014 summer music scene.


